

“Getting Back on Track” 2020-2021 for Teachers

Learning Plan Overview

Teachers are essential to the school’s mission statement of “Learn Today to Excel Tomorrow” and to the collaborative efforts to deliver high quality academic and social emotional educational programming to LPCSC students. In response to stakeholder surveys, LPCSC is in the process of developing a distance learning option for parents/students who elect not to return in-person. Distance learning teachers will be needed to provide an effective distance learning option. This summary is intended to give teachers a general idea of what return options may look like for teachers as new options are created for parents and students. Teachers are asked to review these options to help the administration plan accordingly for student enrollment.


Teachers must understand that there is much work to do to develop these learning options for students. The LPCSC “Getting Back on Track” Plan is subject to changes, additions, and revisions.

Teaching Option 1 Traditional LPCSC Programming



- In-person (on campus) learning K-12 at your school
- Follows Green/Yellow/Red Threat Levels
- Self screen prior to in-person attendance
- Traditional learning modified for social distancing and extra healthy measures. Protective masks provided and required.
- Teachers and students follow district and school re-entry plans
- This option is best suited for teachers who intend to return to employment and instruction in-person.

Teaching Option 2 LPCSC Distance Learning



- Remote (off campus) learning K-12 students
- LPCSC Teachers w/ school working hours (staff report to building)
- LPCSC teachers will establish an instructional schedule.
- A common instructional framework will be established so that there is uniformity amongst distance learning teachers.
- Emphasis on Core Content Areas of Math, Eng./LA, Science, Social Studies for elementary and middle school students.
- Secondary teachers will utilize Edmentum courses unless there is a speciality course assigned by the principal (Ex. Advanced Placement).
- LPCSC Curriculum and Technology
 - Google Classroom, Canvas, Study Island, Edmentum, etc.
- This option is being developed for the 2020-2021 school year and development is ongoing.
- Distance teachers will have a class list of distance enrolled students. Student lists will be organized by grade level and/or curriculum across the district.
- Efforts will be made for the distance enrolled students to maintain on their home school class list, but the distance learning teacher will provide instruction.
- This option may be approved for teachers who are medically fragile or fall into a high risk category or who have another extenuating circumstance approved by the administration. Application process required.

Option 3 LPCSC Homeschool Academy



- The LPCSC Ed Options Academy is a long term distance learning option aimed to service families who elect to be removed from traditional schooling to a full time, long term virtual environment. Parents need to commit to acting as a strong resource to provide support for distance learning with the LPCSC Homeschool Academy.
- Remote learning K-12
- This student option is taught by Non-LPCSC Teachers
- Edmentum Curriculum
- Long Term Option (1+ school years)
- Special Registration will be required
- A special “town hall” meeting is being considered to answer parent questions.
- Homeschool will follow the LPCSC calendar
- The development of the homeschool academy began in 2019-2020 and will continue to be developed in partnership with Ed Options.
- Strong parent commitment required
