

## La Porte High School Announces Valedictorian and Salutatorian Candidates

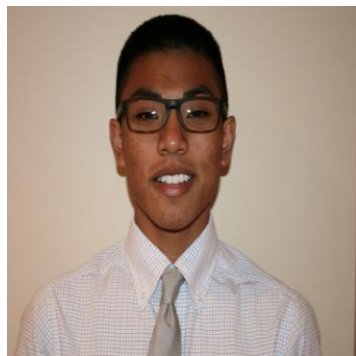
Principal Ben Tonagel, of La Porte High School, is proud to announce the names of the valedictorian and salutatorian candidates from the Class of 2017.
